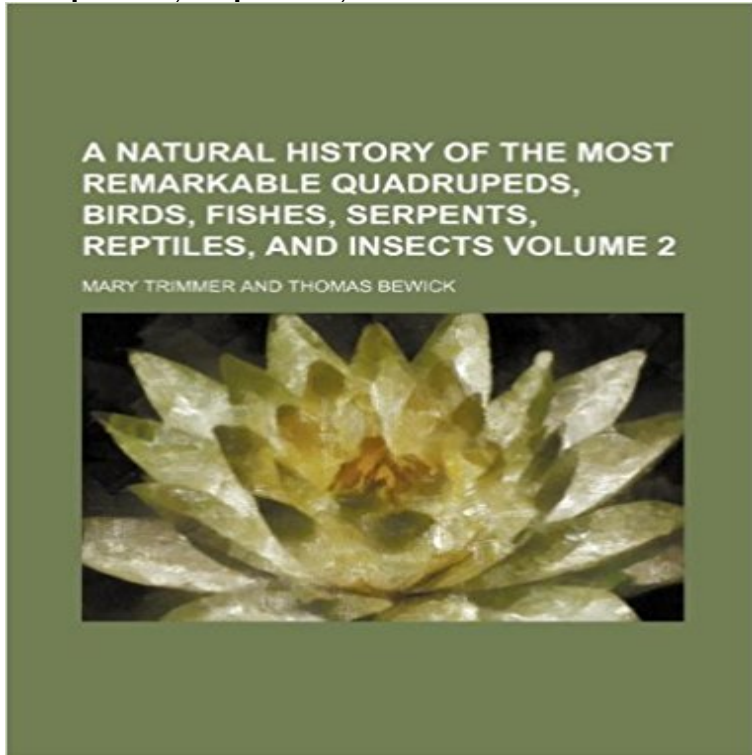

The mouth is large and toothless, and the tail remarkably forked. The most curious peculiarity of the fish is its long, pointed, sword-like upper jaw, which is of a substance like a coarse kind of ivory. This fish has sometimes been found on the British coasts, and is very common in the Mediterranean. The Sicilians consider its flesh as being equal to that of the sturgeon. The Sword Fish possesses a wonderful degree of strength. The Leopard man of war was struck by one of them on her return from a cruise. Though the blow was given while the animal was following the ship, and consequently with less force than if it had been given in an opposite direction, the
