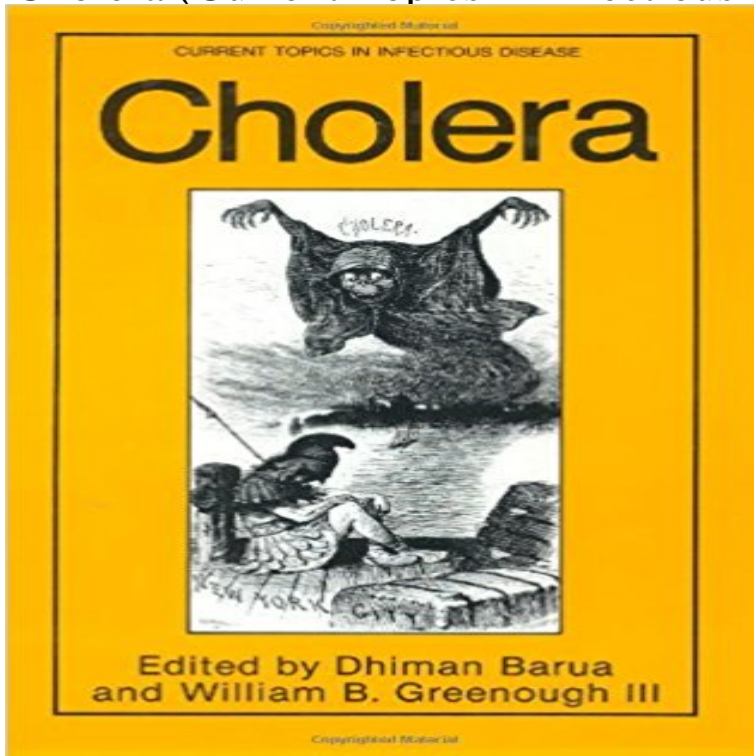


Cholera (Current Topics in Infectious Disease)
