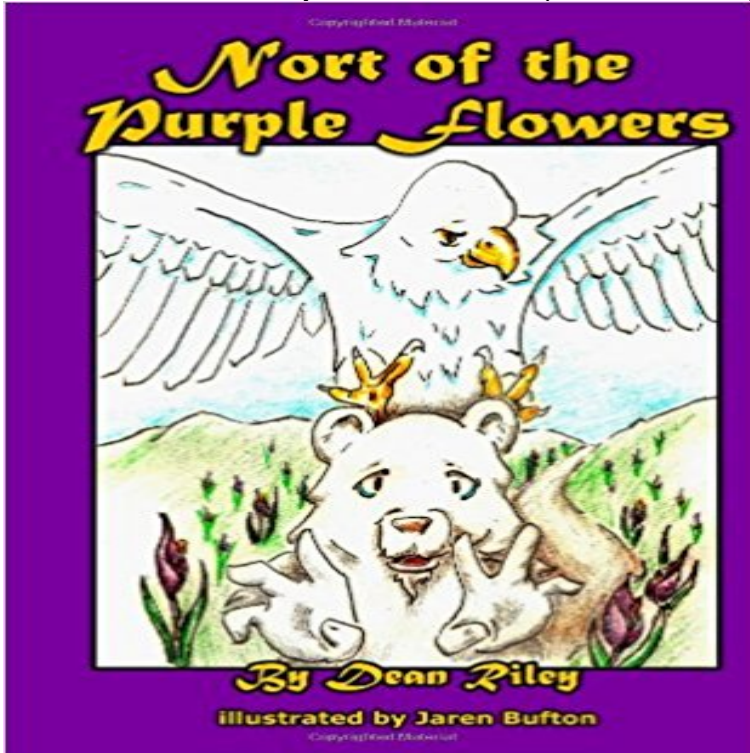


Nort of the Purple Flowers (Volume 1)
