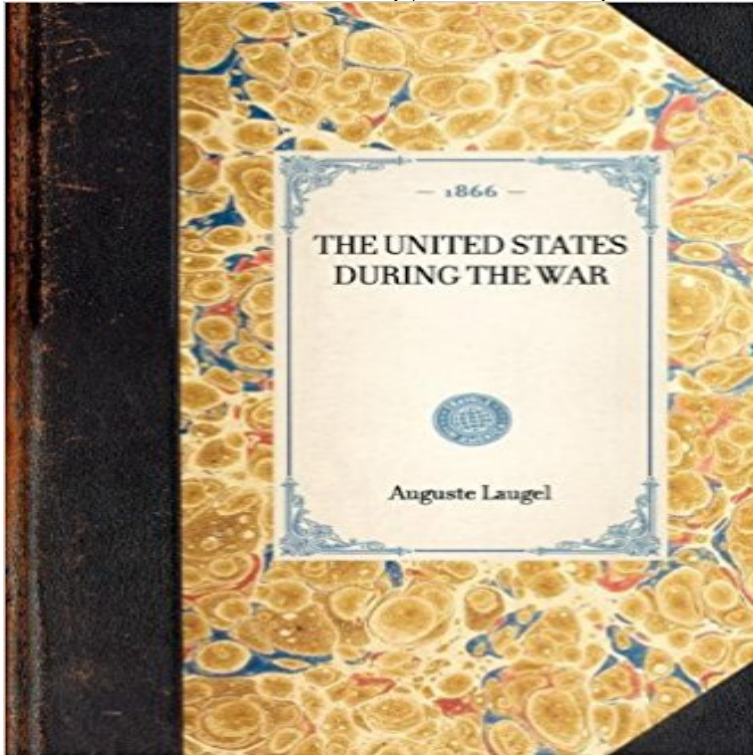


United States During the War (Travel in America)
